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### GINGERBREAD

This recipe makes a soft cookie just right for snacking.

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons ginger
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup melted margarine
- 1/2 cup evaporated milk
- 1 cup unsulfured molasses
- 3/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3/4 teaspoon lemon extract

4 cups stone-ground or unbleached flour, unsifted

Combine the sugar, ginger, nutmeg, cinnamon, salt, and baking soda. Mix well. Add the melted margarine, evaporated milk and molasses.

Add the extracts. Mix well. Add the flour 1 cup at a time, stirring constantly.

The dough should be stiff enough to handle without sticking to fingers. Knead the dough for a smoother texture.

Add up to 1/2 cup additional flour if necessary to prevent sticking.

When the dough is smooth, roll it out 1/4 inch thick on a floured surface and cut it into cookies. Bake on floured or greased cookie sheets in a preheated 375° F oven for 10 to 12 minutes. The gingerbread cookies are done when they spring back when touched.

This recipe also works well for making gingerbread houses.

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### Wilderness First Responder

This is a course designed to train river guides, group leaders and others in advanced first aid techniques. The course lasts for 10 days and the students are put through a series of scenarios.

They learn to work as individuals and as a team to diagnose and treat a wide array of injuries and illnesses that may occur in the backcountry. Common injuries include broken bones, dislocated joints, injuries to the neck and spine, cuts, scrapes, and severe bleeding.

Other topics covered are how to identify and treat allergic reactions, respiratory distress, cardiac arrest, stroke, diabetic emergencies, evacuation procedures, search and rescue techniques, animal/insect bites, and CPR.

I was privileged to attend this course from 10-19 November at the Yellowstone Association Institute in Yellowstone National Park.

This was without a doubt the best training course I have ever attended. Yellowstone in the early winter is wonderful, the wildlife is easy to see and there are no crowds.

The instructors were from the Wilderness Medicine Institute, a part of the National Outdoor Leadership School located in Lander, WY.

Our scenarios included an evening plane crash with victims and a night survival/injury exercise.

I am proud to say that I passed the course and am now a certified Wilderness First Responder.
