GINGERBREAD CORN CAKES

This is a recipe I found in a Dutch Oven cookbook and it has become a family favorite. They are a nice change from ordinary pancakes.

1 cup whole wheat flour
 1/4 cup unbleached all-purpose flour
 1/4 cup yellow cornmeal
 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
 1 teaspoon ground ginger
 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/4 cup molasses
 1 3/4 cups milk
 1/4 cup vegetable oil
 2 eggs, beaten
 oil for greasing griddle/pan

Mix whole wheat flour, cornmeal, baking powder, ginger, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves, salt and molasses. Make a well in the center of the mixture and set aside.

Whisk the milk and oil with the beaten eggs. Pour into well in the dry ingredients. Mix just until smooth. The batter will be thin to start with but will thicken as it stands. Let rest five minutes.

Lightly oil griddle. Pour batter 1/4 cup at a time and cook cakes for 2 to 3 minutes, or until bubbles form on them. Turn and cook 1 to 2 minutes longer.

Top with whipped cream or yogurt and a dash of nutmeg. These are especially good with apples in any form and I usually top them with warm apple pie filling.
