Our guest speaker at the August meeting will be Wayne Sutherland from the U.S. Geological Survey Service.

June Minutes

IMPORTANT: THERE WILL BE NO OUTING THIS YEAR DUE TO THE LOGGING TAKING PLACE IN THE FOXPARK/DOUGLAS CREEK AREA.

Ken Sidors called the meeting to order at 7:15. There were 10 new visitors attending.

Steve Gale from Wyoming Game & Fish gave a presentation on the Douglas Creek drainage, it's fish populations and stream classifications. Steve then went to discuss the Aquatic Invasive Species program and how we could help. The major vector for the spread of these species is human transportation. The big push on now in Wyoming is checking of boats that have been in out of state waters. Marine invasive species have been found in Nebraska, Colorado and Utah, once established it is impossible to eradicate them. It is possible, but not documented, that power dredges, sluice boxes, fishing gear, and even waders can carry species in larval form into Wyoming waters. Steve said that the best way to control the spread is wash the gear and let it dry completely for several days. Boats found to be contaminated must undergo a power washing with water at 140 deg. F. to kill the organisms.

Don Ashley reported the snow depth at Douglas Creek was 4 feet the weekend of 4-5 June. Don has donated the Wolf Sluice he won at the Gem & Mineral Show to the new Casper Chapter to help them get started.

Gem & Mineral Show results: The Silent Auction raised \$1759, there were 606 paid admissions plus kids. \$1000 was raised for a scholarship at UW Geology. The show cleared \$3500 and some of those funds will be used a bus trip to the Denver Mineral Show.

As far as the GPAA raffle more than enough money was made to cover our expenses.

The Cowboy Kids Festival at the Old West Museum was held on Saturday June 11 and was a rousing success. Thanks to all that came out to help.

The Chapter was asked some months ago by the Old West Museum to put on a demonstration during CFD at the Wild Horse Gulch. Shari Baird checked with the CFD organization and that they require a steep rental fee and there were some other considerations that we were not comfortable with, so we will NOT have a presentation at CFD.

Ken reported that there was an article in the Mining Journal concerning using gold and silver for money.

The South Carolina Legislature has abill before it making gold and silver coins legal tender as an alternative to the US Dollar. Utah has already passed a similar law and eleven other states are looking into it.

Please remember that alcohol is not allowed at Chapter meetings.

On a sad note long time member Florence Frantz has passed away. Our thoughts and prayers go out to her family.

A collection was taken up for the PLP and \$54 was collected.
